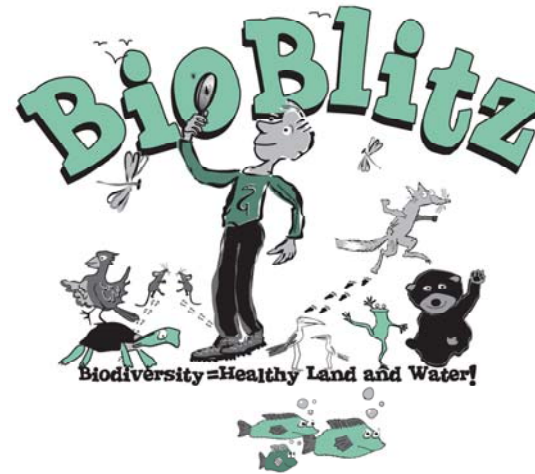


List non-living things that you see - trash, rocks, and man-made objects.
