20 face possible 5 years in jail

NEW YORK-A federal jury yesterday convicted 20 delegates to the 1957 Apalachin, N.Y., crime congress of conspiracy in the biggest federal crackdown on racketeers since the arrest of Al Capone. Three of the defendants are from New Jersey.

All 20 defendants, ranging from hoodlums with long records to a man once named "Man of the Year" in Buffalo, N.Y., were found guilty by the jury of eight men and four women of conspiracy to obstruct justice by lying about the true nature of the mysterious meeting at the home of the late Joseph Barbara.

The Justice Department atrributed the conviction to teamwork by law enforcement officials from all over the nation and a spokesman hailed the coordinated effort as evidence that "syndicated crime may soon have its death knell."

The jury deliberated slightly more than 24 hours before returning the mass guilty verdict. The court announced sentence would be passed on Jan. 14. Conviction carries a possible maximum penalty of five years imprisonment and a \$10,000 fine. All were continued on bail.
